History

The estate sits atop Saint-Émilion's plateau and slopes in one of the appellation's most sought-after locations. Benefitting from a south-southwest exposure, the vibrant vineyard looms over the region like a garden suspended over the limestone rock. Owned by the Duffau-Lagarrosse family since 1847, Beauséjour changed hands in April 2021. Today, the estate is spearheaded by the duo comprised of Prisca Courtin, granddaughter of Clarins founder Jacques Courtin and Joséphine Duffau-Lagarrosse, the ninthgeneration descendant of the storied château. They form a new dynamic and talented team alongside wine consultants Axel Marchal and Julien Viaud, striving to harness all the potential of this exceptional terroir.

2023. A PROLONGED HARVEST

The singularity of the 2023 vintage can be summarised by a handful of key moments. A mild summer, with often overcast skies, gave way to exceptional warm weather in the second half of August. The different geological compositions within the vineyard - particularly the asteriated limestone and the clay-limestone soils - each behaved differently, leading to a notably extended harvest. A total of nine days spread over more than three weeks, 2023 is the longest harvest on record at Beauséjour.

A METICULOUS SORTING PROCESS

A rigorous plot-by-plot selection was carried out to ensure that each vine was harvested at perfect maturity. 2023 also marks the last vintage to be made in the estate's historic vat room, which dates back to the era of Joséphine Duffau-Lagarrosse's grandparents. A new facility will soon welcome the 2024 vintage.

WITH PRECISION COMES HARMONY

The early autumn brought perfect harvest conditions. Extraction was adapted to each vat in order to reveal all the expressions of our terroir.
